- Knowledge acquisition, modeling, and management for CBR
- CBR in engineering, design, manufacturing
- CBR and the Internet
- e-Business applications of CBR
- CBR and human learning
- CBR in software engineering
- CBR in healthcare
- analogical reasoning

Although this is the UK Workshop on CBR, a warm invitation is extended also to researchers from outside the UK to submit a paper, or otherwise attend.
